

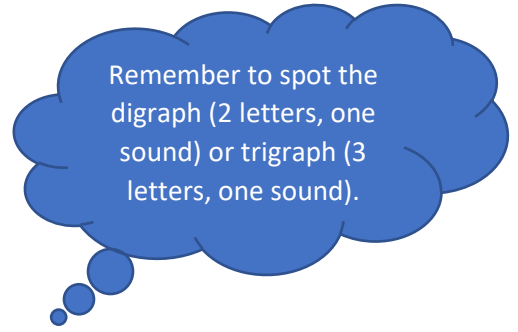
Phonics Activities to support your child with their reading

Use the attached resources in any of the following ways:

Phase 5 Quiz

Use this on a phone, laptop or tablet.

Ask your child to read the questions and answer them. Perhaps the whole family could take part? Record the answers on a piece of paper (the answer sheet is just for guidance).



Phase 5 read and alien word cards and Phase 5 real word flashcards

Stick the words up around the house and read as you pass them. Then rotate their position.

Place one card on alternate stairs and ask your child to read them as they go up and down the stairs.

Hide the words around the garden. Can your child find them and read them to you?

Play pairs with the word cards. Place the cards face down. Take it in turns to turn two over and read the words. If they contain the same digraph, you can keep them.

Set a timer. How many words can you read in 1 minute? Or 2 minutes?

Sort the words into real and alien words.

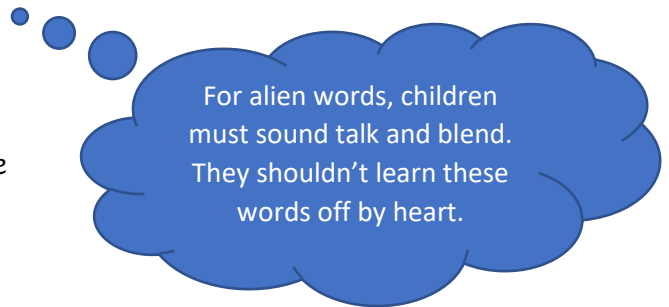
Sort the words according to the digraphs/trigraphs they contain.

Play Snap. Divide the cards between you. Take it in turns to place a card down, reading the word as you do so. If they match because of the starting letter, you say 'snap'.

Phase 5 yes/no question cards

Use these on a phone, laptop or tablet.

Ask your child to read the questions and decide whether the answer is yes or no. Are they sensible questions or silly questions?



Decodable Books

Remember to keep reading your decodable book. The inside front cover contains the significant words for that book and is well worth asking your child to read before they attempt the whole book. The back cover contains useful prompts for you to use when listening to your child read and a set of comprehension questions so that you can see how well your child has understood the book.

Every time you listen to your child read, sign their organiser so they can come to the reading party at the end of each half term.
