

Anti Bullying Champions.

What are Anti Bullying Champions?

In our school, we have a team of dedicated Anti-bullying Champions from Years 5 and 6 (2 from each class) who meet regularly to discuss ways in which to raise awareness of the causes and effects of bullying to others. They are trained to have an awareness of bullying issues and help their peers to overcome possible problems and help spread the school's ethos that bulling is not acceptable.

What do Anti Bullying Champions do?

Our Anti Bullying champions will take their role very seriously and they:

- ensure that all children understand what 'bullying' is
- ensure that they know what to do if someone is bullied and can support others in reporting it
- ensure that Anti Bullying Week is celebrated and are involved in planning activities with the senior leadership team/pastoral team
- promote positive friendships and healthy relationships
- give students a voice on bullying and prejudice issues
- monitor the anti-bullying box and discuss issues with the pastoral team.

The children who represent our school in this group work alongside Mrs Collins, Mrs Marlow and Mrs Barbuti to ensure no pupil in our school feels isolated or unfairly treated and make our school a safe place for all.

The Anti Bullying Champions are visible around school and at lunchtimes, participate in meetings and assemblies and are good listeners. They meet regularly with the pastoral team to discuss issues that have arisen. Every child in school knows who the Anti-bullying Champions are and feel supported by them.
