

Charity Champions.

At RBPS we recognise the importance of helping others less fortunate than ourselves and the positive impact we can have on the world around us, both locally and further afield. We believe it is important for pupils to have an awareness of a range of people from different backgrounds and a desire to help and support others in any way that they can.

What are Charity Champions?

To help run and promote fundraising within school, we have a group of Charity Champions from Years 5 and 6 (2 from each class). These Charity Champions work closely with the Personal Development team to help drive forward positive change and promote charitable work within school.

What do Charity Champions do?

The champions promote and support charitable funds in the following ways:

- Supporting all fundraising days within school.
- Present on opportunities to fundraise in an assembly.
- Take part in 'in and out' of school fund raising opportunities.
- Be a positive role model when promoting charities within school.
- Work alongside the PTA to support the raising of school funds.
- Work alongside the School Councillors to promote fundraising events within school.

Where the children cannot offer support themselves, they refer to teachers.

The Charity Champions will be known around school and will always be on hand to listen to their peers' suggestions for charity events and fundraising ideas. They will bring these ideas to the school councillors.
