Subject: RE- Muslims, Mosques and Prayer

- That Muslims sometimes wear special clothing- women and older girls wear a head scarf, men and women keep their arms and legs covered and men sometimes wear a prayer hat.
- That the 5 pillars of Islam are Shahada Profession of Faith. ; Salat. Prayer. ; Zakat. Giving Alms. ; Sawm. Fasting. ; Hajj. Pilgrimage.
- That Muslims pray 5 times per day and use a prayer mat.
- That a Mosque is a place of worship for Muslims.
