## Richard Bonington Primary School – Active Uniforms Policy

## 1. Purpose

This policy supports the school's commitment to promoting physical activity, comfort, and inclusivity through a flexible, activity-friendly uniform. It is grounded in current research showing that traditional uniforms can limit 's movement and reduce opportunities for spontaneous physical activity.

## 2. Rationale and Research Basis

- A 2025 Youth Sport Trust survey found that:
  - 74% of parents and 67% of primary teachers support an "Always Active Uniform" policy.
  - **63% of parents** believe such a policy benefits their child's education and development [2].
- A University of Cambridge study (2024) found that:
  - Traditional uniforms may **restrict physical activity**, especially among **primary-aged girls**.
  - Countries with strict uniform policies saw **lower levels of daily physical activity**, particularly in younger [1].
- Research from Bristol University (2024) suggests that allowing children to wear PE-style uniforms all day improves comfort, inclusivity, and engagement, especially for girls [3].

## 3. Uniform Guidelines

## 3.1 Daily Active Uniform

Children are expected to wear:

- Polo shirt or t-shirt school-branded or plain in white or green.
- Jumpers/sweatshirt or fleece school-branded or plain in white or green. This includes the Year 6 green hoodies.
- Joggers, leggings, or shorts plain, black.
- Trainers suitable for physical activity, in dark colours

This uniform is designed to be worn **every day**, eliminating the need for a separate PE kit. No cropped tops, or sleeveless tops.

## 3.2 Seasonal Options

- **Summer**: Lightweight shorts, skorts, or short-sleeved polos/t-shirts (styles such as hotpants, Nike Pro-style shorts, or any tight-fitting athletic shorts are not permitted.)
- Winter: Base layers, fleeces, and weather-appropriate outerwear

## 3.3 Outdoor Footwear

• **Wellies** must be always kept in school to enable participation in outdoor learning, forest school, and play in all weather conditions.

#### 4. Expectations and Safety

- Uniforms must be clean, practical, and allow for free movement.
- Trainers are required daily to support spontaneous physical activity.
- Jewellery is not allowed. Only for religious purposes.
- Long hair should be tied back during physical activity.

#### 5. Inclusivity and Accessibility

- The uniform is gender-neutral and inclusive of all identities.
- Adjustments will be made for religious, cultural, or medical needs.

#### 6. Monitoring and Review

This policy will be reviewed **annually** in consultation with staff, parents, and pupils. Feedback will be used to ensure the policy continues to support wellbeing, learning, and inclusivity.
